Frequently Asked Questions: (Rev. 2/2020)

Q: How much does the Panama City Rescue Mission Transitional Living Program cost?

The Panama City Rescue Mission Transitional Living Program costs \$154 per week for those who meet admission criteria and are accepted into the program. Residents are responsible for securing food stamps for food, cost of medical or dental care and other personal items. Residents must obtain employment within 7 days of arriving at our Facility. Other costs to residents include postage stamps, medications, and other incidental expenses that may arise. Health expenses, like dental visits, mental health appointments, etc. must be covered by resident.

Q: How long can a resident stay at this Facility?

The women who are accepted into Transitional Living generally expect to stay a minimum of six months to one year to complete all work of their Case Management plan and begin employment.

Q: What are the requirements for entering into the Panama City Rescue Mission Transitional Living Program?

In order to be accepted into the program one must be able to meet the following requirements:

- Must have a valid drivers' license, state photo I.D. OR a certified birth certificate, social security card, and funds to secure I.D.
- Must not have extensive medical or legal appointments pending or require frequent regularly scheduled mental health, medical or legal appointments. Applicant must be able and ready to focus attention on recovery work immediately and without extensive distractions.
- Must not have court dates pending in which a jail sentence is likely or that require out of town travel.
- Must be physically able to engage in moderately strenuous physical work. Cannot be on SSI/SSDI or applied for SSI/SSDI. The program operates on a worship and work-ordered schedule and fosters return to self-sufficiency and independence.
- If on medication, the client may be required to submit medical and mental health records. All meds must be cleared in advance of acceptance.
- Must bring a minimum of 30 days of all approved medications and have plan to pay for refills.
- Must be prepared to engage in rigorous course of study in principles and practices of the Christian faith.

Q. Are phone calls, mail, and visitation allowed?

Phone calls are allowed on your personal cell phone. Only business calls are allowed on the Panama City Rescue Mission business phone with permission from staff. Incoming and outgoing mail and packages will be monitored. Visitations of adults are not allowed on campus without approval from your Transition Program Manager. No off-site visitations are allowed.

Q. What is the tobacco policy? Residents are allowed to smoke in the designated smoking areas.

Q. What do I need to bring?

Due to limited space, all items brought in at admission (clothing, shoes, snacks, etc.) must fit inside the space provided- a single door width closet, a small chest of drawers, and a bedside table. We cannot store out of season clothing and other items. Other items to bring are:

Identification documents: Picture ID or Driver's License or certified birth certificate and Social Security Card.

Personal Items: Ibuprofen, tylenol, or vitamins (all must be new, sealed bottles), toiletries.

Clothing: Women are required to wear women's clothing. Modest/casual clothing is appropriate for most activities. Bring casual/dressy clothing for church services. Bring appropriate clothing and shoes for recreation and work. Length of shorts or dresses should be no more than three inches above the knee or below extended fingertips. No tiny-strap or low-cut shirts. Shirt straps must be at least two inches wide. No heels over 2" high.



Q. Are there any prohibited items?

Drugs, alcohol, non-approved medication.

No herbal sleep aids including melatonin, dyphenhydramine, etc. or stimulants.

Anything containing alcohol: mouthwash, cologne, etc.

Acetone based nail polish remover or aerosol hairspray.

Pocket knife or any item that could be considered a weapon.

Non-approved or secular books, videos, magazines and/or music, or burned C.D.'s.

No clothing or items with references to alcohol, gambling, tobacco or profanity.

No pets.

Staff strives to limit students' contact with negative influences. Therefore, staff reserves the right to make discretionary decisions concerning particular clothing, hair style or color, etc. It is imperative that prohibited items are not brought on campus as they are harmful to the individual who brings them, as well as to others in the program. Violators are subject to dismissal.

Q: How do I or someone I know apply for the Panama City Rescue Mission Transitional Living Program?

If you or someone you know would like to apply for the Panama City Rescue Mission Transitional Living Program, contact us by phone to request an application. An application will be mailed or emailed to the caller. The completed application may be mailed or emailed back to the contact at the top of the application above. If applicant meets basic requirements, a phone or face-to-face interview will be scheduled by a case manager. Upon approval by the case manager, the prospective student must arrive by the day and time specified or lose the reserved bed. Those coming from incarceration must come directly from the facility to Panama City Rescue Mission. Our phone number is 850-914-0533.
